# 1. Minutes of previous meeting on 27 March 2019

Revision 1 was Signed by AF. Actions arising therefrom:

1.1. **(3.1)** ALL to think about a suitable location for the new equipment shed.

## 2. Treasurer's Report

Distributed by **KF** through email. Committee discussion points:

- 2.1. Surplus from events since 01-Sep-2018: £4103
- 2.2. CST Final: This year, there will not be the usual large expenditure on subsidising travel to the Final, because we did not qualify.
- 2.3. **KeP**: Jackets: The sample jackets were taken to the JK, but not tried out because the weather was too hot. We need to turn this round quite quickly and get a mass order submitted. The order needs to be for the right sizes and numbers, and avoid holding a large stock. It is unlikely we will get the mass order delivered before Scottish 6 Days, but we have 10 pieces that can be tried on and then sold.

ACTION: Mailchimp note inviting members to attend the Ringwood event on 22 Jun and try the jackets on: CB

- 2.4. RK: Query regarding Dorset Schools: There were 86 competitors @ £4 for each entry. But the accounts show revenue of £492 for the event, which sounds like too much. AF will check with KF.
- 2.5. KeP: Query regarding cash in the Bank: We are holding £9523.87. Should we invest a further £5000 in Premium Bonds? Yes we should, but the Premium Bonds must be held by an individual (KF), so we need to ensure that the agreement between Wimborne Orienteers and **KF** is still valid.

Decision: Purchase £5000 more Premium Bonds

# 3. **Equipment**

3.1. Storage: Equipment to be removed from Andrew Howard's barn

Andrew Howard is not desperate for removal of the few remaining items in the barn. The frequently-used equipment is already at AF/KF's house, with only seldom-used equipment remaining.

**BE** suggested a caravan storage park could be used to site a new shed. Possibly, an old caravan could be used instead of a shed. This could be a very cost-effective solution.

After further discussion, it was realised that when the time finally comes to vacate Andrew Howard's barn, the remaining items can be split between the dwellings of the committee members as follows:

Wooden Stiles: PH

Rolls of orange plastic crowd control barrier netting: AF

### 3.2. Start Clock

**JW** suggested the purchase of a new start clock.

The committee felt that the cost of a start clock is unnecessary, due to their being superseded by technology. An app on a Smartphone or tablet works better, and is a great deal cheaper.

#### 3.3. SI Air+

**ES** suggested purchase of a set of SI Air+ and SIAC cards. These would be an investment that would pay for itself over time. The set could be rented out to other clubs.

**RK** commented that we should hold no more than 50 of the cards. For large events, more can be borrowed.

One concern is that nothing is recorded at each control to indicate that a competitor has visited. This is a safety concern in the event of organising a search for a non-finisher. With the SI system we have, it is possible to interrogate the boxes, and focus the search around the competitor's last-punched control.

However, none of the present committee could remember an occasion when this was actually done, and it was agreed that any search party would be dispatched immediately, rather than wait until the control boxes had been collected.

ACTION: Research costs and details of SI Air+ and SIAC: RK

### 3.4. Electronic Payment

**BE** Suggested using an electronic Smartphone app-based payment system at events. This depends on available signal, which is not guaranteed in the forest. However, this should certainly be encouraged as the way forward.

4.4. Fri 10 May 2019 Dorset Schools Championships, Avon Heath

Recent changes to the school calendar mean that there is now a clash with exam dates.

**RK** suggested that next year the date should be a week later, inside World Orienteering week. This year, that would have been 15-21 May. Wed 20 May 2020 was agreed as desirable. To be confirmed.

## 4.6. Mon 03 Jun 2019 Informal, Wareham Old Town Walls

Good map, well planned. £25 was donated towards trip to Borneo for Agnes Brooke.

#### 4.7. POC at Thorncombe Wood

This area is beside Hardy's Cottage. It has been recently mapped, and there is a POC, which is OrientO enabled. The area may be used for events, but only out of peak times, due to sharing of the car park with Hardy's Cottage and dog walkers.

**RK** showed two maps: 1:3500 for POC, and 1:4000 for events. The 1:3500 needs the addition of a note regarding Environment Agency copyright.

#### 4.8. Meeting with local clubs at the Fighting Cocks

**KeP** attended, together with representatives from SOC, WSX and SARUM. Discussion was centred around the New Forest agreement, which is due for renewal next year.

Colin Hicks is working on renewing the agreement for another 5 years.

A map board was displayed with an overview of all the mapped areas of the Forest. There are some unmapped gaps .

**CB:** There is spare allocation for NF events in Level B and night events. SOC are willing to loan areas. If the allocation is not used then it might not be renewed. Night events can be run from a pub.

## 5. Caddihoe 2020 organising committee: overall Organiser, Planners

A meeting is scheduled for 19-June-2019 to sort out the main officials for the weekend. In attendance will be **ES, CB, KeP, AF,** and WSX representatives.

The Middle and Long will be part of UKOL.

Day 2 will not be a chasing start.

To be decided:

- Urban / Sprint event when?
- WIM 50 years celebrations when and what?

**KeP** proposed erecting the world's biggest maze on the hockey field at Fordingbridge School, which can be open all weekend.

Any profits from the event will be split equally between WIM and WSX, after making a contribution to SOC for use of the areas.
