



Wimborne WRNL 20th January 2024



Location: British Legion, West Borough, Wimborne, BH21 1LT

Parking: The closest car park is Westfield Close car park, BH21 1ES which is free after 18:00. Exit the car park to the east onto Redcotts Lane, turn left and the British Legion is on your right

Entries: [Racesignup](#) by Thursday 16th January. Entries after this is subject to map availability.

Entry fees: Senior: £7. Senior SI card hire: £1. Juniors £4 (must be accompanied by an adult), Junior card hire: Free.

Safety: Hi-viz clothing/ vests, backup light and whistles are mandatory. Under 16s must be always accompanied by a parent or legal guardian on their course. Competitors are responsible for their own safety at all times and should be aware of fast-moving traffic on the course. If you have a medical condition, please write it on a piece of paper and leave in a sealed envelope with the organiser; uncollected envelopes will be destroyed after the event.

Start and finish times: Starts are from 18:15 to 19:00. Course closes at 20:15. Help with control collection would be much appreciated.

Map: 1:5000 overprinted with control codes and score values.

Terrain: Urban

Format: The course is a straight 60-minute score course using SIAC enabled SI control stations on small O kites.

Course and score information: You have 60 minutes to go from the start to the finish via as many controls as possible. You gain points for each control visited but you lose 10 points per minute – or part minute late back. Points per control may vary from 10 to 50. Bonus points (5 per minute under the hour) are available but **ONLY** if you manage to visit every control.

Post-event food: It is planned that hot food will be available to pre-order at the British Legion (likely chilli/veggie chilli) – further details and how to pre-order will be posted and circulated to all entrants early in the New Year.
